Heather and Glenn commented on the great display of orchids this month.

The man who survived mustard gas and pepper spray is now a seasoned veteran.

CULTURE: Spring is just around the corner hopefully with some very pleasant days recently and noticeably warmer temperatures. This is the time when you should be taking advantage of the rapid growth your orchids should soon be making. Water, light and fertilizer are the important things they will need to achieve this. Flower spikes need training and support with a stake where needed. I know we have been critical of some of your flower presentation efforts recently during the plant commentaries (including mine) but it can mean the difference between a prize certificate and being overlooked. Give your flowers the best possible chance by making them stand out and look up at the judges, not hang their heads in shame. Get rid of unsightly foliage with a pair of scissors, trim stakes to be level with the top of the flower inflorescence and use ties that are unobtrusive such as the green clips or green coated wire.

RESEARCH

Ron Reeves benched 2 unusual orchids at our last meeting that deserve mention. The first was Cattleya quadricolor a native of Brazil and not often seen displayed. I had one for a while which never flowered and finally succumbed to the cool conditions it was subjected to. Ron grows his indoors and it certainly looked healthy with lots of greenery and 2 beautiful flowers which have a natural habit of not opening fully and consequently regarded (undeservedly) as not a show plant. The other plant of his was the pure white Cattleya intermedia f. alba. It is fairly hard to find in cultivation these days. This was flowering well with no hint of colour even in the lip. The inflorescence stands up and displays itself to its full glory glistening in the light with a white almost as pure as you could get.

My slab mounted Laelia autuminalis flowering now should possibly be renamed 'springalis' as it was a little out of season. This is another plant seldom seen on the show benches and I was fortunate to revive it from an old collection gradually bringing it back to life with plenty of new growths after it responded favourably to some judicious back-cutting once it was in growth. As Alf noted last meeting this along with many other Laelias do well in our climate and we should be growing more of them. But do your homework before purchasing, as there are a number of warmer growers too. (See photo pages)

NEW MEMBERS CULTURE: Great to see some more Novice plants back on our benches. HOS show rules have been changed and we now classify a Novice grower for 3 years after the Beginner class. It is considered most club rules re a Novice don't give them a chance with usually 3 firsts in any show enough to send them up to Open Class. These days with so few Novice exhibitors this is frequently achieved in 1 year.

New growths on your orchids are quite delicate and brittle and very prone to being 'knocked off' by big fingered growers like myself. It has taken me a long time to realize this at the expense of many a new bulb, flower spike and developing 'eye' unseen hidden down in the media. Be extra careful repotting as the last thing you do, pressing the media down into the pot, will be the straw that breaks the new growth off.

Keep flowering plants on the cool and dry side to prolong them for the shows in the best condition.
