I do understand we can lose labels when disasters happen when a tray gets tipped over, such as I have had when a neighbour's cat jumped up onto a bench one night, or when a whole shelf of orchids got upended during a big storm. I now have doors on all my houses and roofs are well fixed. But even the best laid plans can go awry as during a very strong wind my tunnel house flexed so much it sprung the door open out of the frame. Fortunately my neighbour heard it banging and came to the rescue. I'm not sure how Britain earned the name as the 'windy isles' but I think NZ must be one of the windiest places I have ever been.



CULTURE

Well the weather has been mostly wet and then it just gets wetter. If you had any orchids outside for the last few months they would have either drowned or evolved into water lilies. At least it hasn't been too cold which is always a bonus. Well we do live in the 'Land of the long black cloud'. Many plants will be showing signs of new growth soon so start to water gradually as the weather improves. Be aware that we can still get some very cold nights well into spring.

Water dripping down onto new flowers is causing me headaches as well as many others I imagine.

Be sure to keep an on eye on the pseudo bulbs and if they start to shrivel they need water. Those without bulbs need more water. Sarcochilus will be sending out flower inflorescences soon and snails just love them! As we can see, a few of the Aussie Dendrobiums are starting to flower. They always make a nice show and often have a sweet scent. To make them last longer keep in a cool place. A spray with fungicide/insecticide may be needed soon as I've noticed an increase in aphids this year since my plants have better protection from the weather.

This was an outstanding specimen winning the Trophies for Best Specimen plant and Best Species; a fantastic effort not only to grow it to perfection but to get it to the show in one piece. Other certificates were awarded to Michelle; 2^{nd} for her *Pleione formosana* 'Cutie' and 3^{rd} for *Cym.* Ice on Fire 'Nikkita'.

Anton & Janet's mini *Phal*. Bedford Pixie received a 3^{rd} and Pam Forde's *Pterostylus* a 3^{rd} also. Glenn and Manee benched some of their plants (those in colours not suitable for our display) and won a 1^{st} in the small flower species class (*Ansellia africana*), 1^{st} for cluster type Cattleya (*C*. Pure Yellow) and a 3^{rd} for small flowered *Ctt*. Fire Dance.
