CULTURE

Now that winter is approaching maximum light should be given to most of your orchids. The more tender varieties can still burn in direct midday sun and water on left on leaves will cause rot. Watering still needs to continue if new bulbs are growing as many of mine are. It may be better to water on a wet day, which is usually warmer than clear ones when frosts are possible. An early morning watering gives the plants a chance to dry out before night.

I have recently put everything under cover for the winter, which helps in the control of water. As many of you will have seen in Anton's talk last year it doesn't have to be anything fancy if you are growing predominantly cool varieties.

Although you can grow many of the 'intermediate' ones cool it does pay to keep them dry over winter. I have found that some extra comfort with these (eg. Cattleyas) will pay dividends with better growth and better flowering.

The article in the Wairarapa newsletter, which was forwarded to you gave excellent coverage of these points.

Slugs and snails are very active this time of the year and can ruin a good flower that you may have been waiting a long time for.

There are a number of methods for stopping condensation dripping onto plants. Double skin covering is the best. Steeply pitched roofs are better than flatter ones. Fans kept going in the orchid house can help.

RESEARCH

Another couple of puzzles have appeared, one brought up by Michelle. With her eye for detail I was asked why the labels on two identical plants were different. One said Oda. Charlesworthii and the other had Oncda Charlesworthii. Now this may appear a small difference but in fact is quite significant.

Oda. = Odontioda (Odontoglossum x Cochlioda)

Oda. Charlesworthii = C noezliana x Odm. harryanum

Odcda. = Oncidiota. (Oncidium x Cochlioda)

Oncda. Charleworthii = C. noezliana x Onc. incurvum

My guess is that the plants we commonly see labeled with Oda. should be Oncda. based on the photos and descriptions I can find but next time they are in flower I will get them analysed by our expert Alf Day. Unfortunately that won't be until next year.

If something is confidential, it will be left in the copier machine.
