CULTURE: You should be fertilising and watering when the conditions are right but be wary of over watering if the weather stays cool. Many growers taking holidays and entrusting the care of their precious plants to someone else can run into problems when conditions are so changeable. A letter to the editor in a recent edition of the AOS magazine said it may be prudent to leave orchids not watered for a few weeks rather than risk overwatering. If you go away at the height of summer they will need some attention. Repotting should be almost completed except for those plants just coming into flower. It is a good idea to cut all others in flower sooner rather than later to give them a good start for next season. Watering of actively growing plants in warm weather should be frequent and thorough. Build up your fertiliser strengths gradually over spring. (Bring in a sample for Anton to test if unsure of strength). Snails and slugs are active now and can cause a lot of damage so sprinkle 'Baysol' around. It is more effective if ground up a little but don't get it on your skin. Other softer types are dissolved quickly by water. At this time of the year you should also be very vigilant for insect attacks. They can multiply rapidly and once down into the sheaves around bulbs and root systems are very difficult to get rid of. Always look up under the leaves (and spray there) as they will congregate on the undersides.

Over the hottest months humidity should be kept up by misting frequently and plants such as Masdevallias or Odonts kept as cool as possible.

Shading may need to be provided over summer and ensure water is not left sitting on leaves in direct sun.

## **EDITOR'S COMMENT**

It was a hectic 17 days for us in Thailand where we fit in a lot in a very short time.

We last visited 5 years ago and the changes are quite noticeable. Bangkok has opened a new underground rail system in the last 2 years, plus a monorail system, which has relieved a lot of the congested roads. They have also invested huge amounts into new super-highways (many on huge columns above existing motorways), the largest airport in the world, lots of new buildings and shopping centres and much more. The economy seems buoyant with mostly new cars on the roads and food available in abundance everywhere. We traveled to out of the way places and the above was true wherever we visited.

The main reason for the trip was to visit the Royal Flora Expo being held in the northern city of Chiangmai (approx. same distance Auckland – Wellington) at which we spent 2 days.

We also visited the flower market in Bangkok, took a day trip to Ayutthaya (ancient city) bus/boat, went to Doi Inthanon National Park (2500m above sea level) and Doi Tung (Royal sponsored garden and plant propagation project – see article in AOS magazine earlier this year).

Thailand has a very warm climate and was very hot (30 deg.) even in the north which is supposed to be coming into its cooler season (Dec/Jan). As mentioned in last month's newsletter we saw first hand the devastation caused by the extensive flooding in the middle of the country where there are hundreds of square kilometres still under water. Many roads are impassable, houses under water and rice crops ruined. I will give more details of some of the above places we visited with particular emphasis on orchids (of which there were plenty) in coming months.
