CULTURE

Well another year has nearly come to a close and you should be concentrating on getting the maximum growth out of your orchids during the warmer months. This means constant attention to watering, fertilizing, misting and pest control. I found a lot of resident slugs in many of my orchid pots when I repotted this year. As mentioned during the last plant commentary the grass grub moth may have laid eggs in your pots and the larvae will be eating the roots **now**. This is evident by a residue that looks like sawdust on the surface of the mix. Daizanon granules sprinkled in the pot will control these as well as ant colonies.

It's a good time to give your Phallies a couple of weeks of cooler nights (if we have any) to initiate flower spikes. They will then be in flower for the shows next year.

Give your Cymbidiums and Dendrobiums plenty of sun now. Be sure to keep the Masdevallias misted and in the coolest part of your garden over summer. Sarcochilus will need some shading also. The Cattleya Alliance need plenty of bright light but not scorching sun or heat. Give them good ventilation also. The Oncidiniae Alliance is one group many of us struggle with including myself. Those predominantly with Oncidium in the breeding can take higher light and cope with drier conditions. The Odontoglossum crosses (eg. Oda.), need plenty of moisture and cooler conditions. The problems come with the complex hybrids, which have a number of different genera in their make up. Only experience or gleaning knowledge from our resident expert Alf Day will help with these.

Many of the plants I keep indoors now get put outside under shelter to get some fresh air where they are easier to water as they dry out a lot quicker over the summer. There are draw backs to this practice as they can get burnt if left wet or rot on a cool night.
