This year we had plenty of flowering Cymbidiums and Phallies which were in high demand by the public. Some genera were down in numbers but I think this is due to fewer of the more unusual ones being grown and consequently less surplus plants being available from amateur growers. There were also very few Dendrobiums around, unusual for this time of year and our sales area.

As usual there was a queue waiting to come into the show at 9am Saturday. The flow was steady throughout the day and nearly everything was sold by 4pm. Many HOS members came in to help both days and some went that extra mile by working from start to finish almost without a break and we are very grateful to you all. Thanks also to those that provided nourishment both Friday and Saturday. Lea Westlake catered for the judges again with her awardable bacon and egg pie and the delicious vegetarian quiche. Break down was again done in record time with many helpers. Behind the scenes show Marshal Anton prepared all the paper work and strengthened the signs amongst many other tasks.

On the Sunday prior to the show Anton, Glenn and John Muddiman braved the traffic and erected 24 around the area covering all the main road entry and exits into Howick. After the show these had to be dismantled and Steven Tung's help (and speed) was invaluable.

# CULTURE

With the high winds we have been experiencing lately orchids in bark and open mixes dry out very quickly so keep up with your watering. I have been asked the question a few times lately of what to do when the mix dries out so much that the water just runs through without seemingly wetting anything! The answer here is to put pot and all into a tub of water and leave soak for an hour or so. I know this is a painful process but can be done easily if you keep your plants on trays as I do. Another thing I do is take out the trays of orchids and leave them in the rain. Having your plants in trays has other advantages. You can shift them around quickly and easily. They don't blow over. You can keep similar genera all together. It also saves on mesh or support material on your shelves

as the trays only need a couple of rails to sit on. You can also remove the trays and clean under the shelves quickly.
