EDITOR'S COMMENT

This newsletter is early so that you are all prepared for our SHOW.

We usually give a lot of details on what help you can provide but this year will keep it brief. If you are able please come and partake in this annual event and provide any help you can.

This year we could do with a few more on Friday at 11.30am to help set up tables and arrange the hall as last year the heavy work was left to just a few. The ladies usually set out the clothes which is a time consuming operation.

Judging starts at 6.30pm (Frid) and if you want to partake by helping with the certificates or other tasks you are welcome to attend. As always this is a learning experience.

On Saturday our club members are invaluable in the hall interacting with the public in any way they can. Members can also help out with security and standing in for others while they have a break from the entry desk, raffle, sales and other duties. Every little bit helps.

CULTURE

It is now getting warmer with longer days and growth starting on many orchids. This is a very important time to start watering and fertilizing. Even though nights are on the cool side they have been mostly around 10 - 11 degrees, which is bordering on the range of intermediate growers. My Cattleyas and others less tolerant of cool conditions are all showing signs of new growth. With the spring weather we also get insects and other problems arriving. Now is a time to get stuck into repotting including dividing any oversized plants. Dividing orchids is a whole subject in itself and can be a trap for many new growers. Some orchids do not like root disturbance and knowing which ones you can 'butcher' takes some time and heartache to learn. I now prefer to 'back cut' many and leave them in their pots for a further growing season before removing them to divide. This requires assessing the plant well before you actually attempt to divide it and is probably worth devoting a little time to at a club meeting again. Repotting can be done at any time but at this time be wary of accidently knocking off the new shoots which are extremely brittle and quite often hidden down in the bulb sheath.
